Early Education and Care in Brookfield

- According to the 2000 Census, 64.9% of 3-5 year-olds in Brookfield are enrolled in preschool.
- Of those children enrolled in preschool in Brookfield, 32 (43.2%) attend public school pre-kindergarten, according to the Department of Education. The remaining 56.8% are enrolled in community-based or family child care programs.
- In Brookfield, there is 1 public school preschool program, 0 licensed center-based programs, and 5 licensed family child care programs, according to the Department of Early Education and Care.
- As of January 2007, 3 children ages 0-14 were on a waiting list to receive a child care subsidy from the Department of Early Education and Care, of which 1 is of preschool-age (2.9-5 years).
- The Department of Early Education and Care estimates that 16 of Brookfield's jobs are in the early education and care industry.
- The average salary of a preschool teacher in the Worcester Area is \$28,770, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.
