Early Education and Care in Gloucester

- According to the 2000 Census, 54.2% of 3-5 year-olds in Gloucester are enrolled in preschool.
- Of those children enrolled in preschool, 62 (10.3%) attend public school preschool, according to the Department of Education. The remaining 89.7% are enrolled in community-based or family child care programs.
- In Gloucester, there is one public school preschool program, 15 licensed center-based programs, and 24 licensed family child care programs, according to the Department of Early Education and Care.
- As of January 2007, 69 eligible children in Gloucester were on a waiting list to receive a child care subsidy from the Department of Early Education and Care. 25 of those children are of preschool-age (2.9-5 years).
- The Department of Early Education and Care estimates that 239 of Gloucester's jobs are in the early education and care industry.
- The average salary of a preschool teacher in the Boston-NH Metropolitan Area is \$28,820, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.
