Early Education and Care in Holyoke

- According to the 2000 Census, 48.0% of preschool-aged children (3-4yrs) in Holyoke attend school.
- According to the Departments of Early Education and Care (EEC) and Elementary and Secondary Education, Holyoke has 17 licensed center-based programs, 52 licensed family child care providers, and 179 children attending public school preschool at Joseph Metcalf Preschool.
- In August 2008, 112 eligible children were on a waiting list to receive a child care subsidy from EEC and 23 were of preschool-age (2.9-5yrs).
- EEC estimates that 336 of Holyoke's jobs are supported by the early education and care industry.
- The average salary of a preschool teacher in the Springfield Metropolitan Area is \$29,610, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Early Education Grant Programs in Holyoke

Universal Pre-Kindergarten (UPK) grants:

- UPK Classroom Quality grant funding has been awarded to Holyoke Chicopee Springfield Head Start, Inc.
- In FY08, Assessment Planning grant funding was awarded to Joseph Metcalf Preschool, and 2 additional Assessment Planning grants were awarded to family child care systems representing providers in the Western MA region.

Full-Day Kindergarten grants:

- In FY08, Holyoke Public Schools received Quality grant funding to support 24 full-day kindergarten classrooms.
