



Building Careers in Early Education and Care

The intention of the Building Careers grant program is to fund college courses and academic advising for early education and care and out-of-school time educators who are seeking a degree in early childhood education or a related field.

The program is designed to help non-traditional students succeed academically and professionally by providing career and academic advising, using a cohort model, and scheduling courses at times that are convenient for working adults.

The Building Careers grant program was funded through a federal grant that expired after Fiscal year 2007 (FY07). In FY08, the state preserved the program with a supplemental appropriation of \$600,000. In FY09, the state appropriated \$1.2 million to the program, matching the full amount previously provided under the federal grant.

Goals of the Building Careers in Early Education and Care program are:

- To increase the number of educators in the field with a degree in early childhood education or a related field;
- To increase access to higher education for early education and care and out-of-school time educators in the field;
- To promote high quality professional development; and
- To encourage partnerships and broad-based collaborative planning efforts that leverage and maximize resources across public and private agencies.

To be eligible to participate in the Building Careers program students must:

- Be a Massachusetts resident and U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen;
- Work in a program serving EEC-funded children (i.e., group child care, family child care, school age child care, or Head Start programs);
- Have completed a college-level course for credit in child growth and development (please note that new students from a vocational technical program do not need to meet this requirement);
- Agree to meet with an academic advisor for career/academic counseling;
- Agree to complete student data forms each semester and share directory information with Building Careers Coordinator and EEC;
- Maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or above;
- Participate in work-site observations and supervision meetings (if applicable); and
- Matriculate into a degree program in early childhood education or a related field within one year.
